IF STATE = MICHIGAN THEN DISPLAY BALLOT DESCRIPTION: Proposal 22-3, which would amend the Michigan Constitution to add a right to choose to have an abortion and use contraceptives, and allow state regulation of abortion after the point of fetal viability.

IF STATE = VERMONT THEN DISPLAY BALLOT DESCRIPTION: Proposal 5, which would amend the Vermont Constitution to add a right to "personal reproductive autonomy" that cannot be infringed unless by a compelling state interest in the least-restrictive means.

NOTE: In order to limit interview length, respondents were randomly assigned to one of four questionnaire forms. Each form asked the questions listed below. Some questions noted below were asked on all four forms in a given state while being asked of a quarter of respondents in all other states. National sample respondents were asked all form questions.
